

### **2019 Legislative Session Report**

May 2, 2019

The 2019 Legislative Session of the Mississippi Legislature adjourned on March 29, 2019. This year, IHL tracked 380 measures of interest to the university system. Of these, 40 became law, including the nine IHL appropriation bills and two measures requested by the system.

This Legislative Session Report summarizes the final resolution of all measures followed by IHL during the 2019 Legislative Session. The next Regular Session of the Mississippi Legislature will convene at noon on Tuesday, January 7, 2020.

### Appropriations – Approved by the Governor:

The Legislature appropriated \$710,355,423 for the FY 2020 university system budget. This represents an increase of \$37,627,758, or 5.6%, in state support for the system. The increased funds are tied to new expenses including the PERS employer contribution increase and an increase in the employee health insurance premium, as well as repairs to campus facilities.

The Legislature appropriated \$14.5 million from the Capital Expense Fund for repair and renovation to campus facilities. The funds were allocated using a formula of 50% square footage and 50% enrollment in SB 3005, Section 41, as follows:

Alcorn State University – \$732,372

Delta State University – \$607,055

Jackson State University – \$1,175,025

Mississippi State University (including the Forest and Wildlife Research Center and the Division of Agriculture Forestry and Veterinary Medicine) – \$3,819,858

Mississippi University for Women – \$534,143

Mississippi Valley State University – \$696,445

University of Mississippi (including University of Mississippi Medical Center) – \$4,557,151

University of Southern Mississippi – \$2,377,951

### Capital Improvements Bonds Legislation – Approved by the Governor:

The Legislature approved <u>SB 3065</u>, which included \$85,382,500 in bonds for capital improvements to the university campuses and the Education and Research Center. A summary of the projects included in SB 3065 is included below.

### ASU - \$6,320,000

Planning, repair, renovation, life safety and ADA code upgrades, furnishing and equipping of campus buildings, facilities, and infrastructure and continuation and completion of previously authorized projects.

### **ASU Division of Agriculture – \$720,000**

Phase I of repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping and expansion of and additions to the Child Development Laboratory Center.

#### Delta State University – \$7,320,000

Planning, repair, renovation, life safety and ADA code upgrades, furnishing and equipping and expansion of and additions to campus buildings, facilities, and infrastructure.

### Jackson State University - \$6,740,000

Repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping and expansion of and additions and improvements to campus buildings, facilities and infrastructure.

#### Mississippi State University - \$10,320,000

Phase II of construction, furnishing and equipping of a new building and related facilities to house the Kinesiology Department – \$10,000,000.

Preplanning of construction, demolition, furnishing and equipping of a new building and related facilities to house the College of Architecture, Art and Design – \$320,000.

### Mississippi State University Division of Agriculture, Forestry and Veterinary Medicine – \$7,987,500

Repair and renovation of buildings and related facilities at the Sustainable Bioproducts Complex and repair and renovation of Ballew Hall and related facilities.

#### Mississippi University for Women – \$6,645,000

Phase I of construction, furnishing and equipping of a new building and related facilities to house the Culinary Arts Program.

### Mississippi Valley State University – \$6,320,000

Phase I of Student Union improvements and planning, repair, renovation, life safety and ADA code upgrades, furnishing and equipping and expansion of and additions to campus buildings, facilities, and infrastructure.

#### University of Mississippi – \$5,320,000

Repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping and expansion of and additions to the Data Center Building and related facilities.

### University of Mississippi Medical Center - \$12,000,000

Matching funds for site development, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping, additions to and expansion of Blair E. Batson Children's Hospital and related facilities at the University of Mississippi Medical Center.

### University of Southern Mississippi – \$13,300,000

Planning, repair, renovation, life safety and ADA code upgrades, furnishing and equipping and expansion of and additions to campus buildings including the Cook Library and Old Kinesiology, other facilities, and infrastructure – \$8,300,000.

Construction of improvements, upgrades and additions to campus infrastructure including roads and streets, sidewalks, parking lots and related facilities – \$5,000,000.

#### University of Southern Mississippi Gulf Coast Campuses – \$1,700,000

Planning, repair, renovation, life safety, and ADA code upgrades, furnishing and equipping of campus buildings, facilities, and infrastructure at any of the coast campuses including Gulf Park, Halstead and Cedar Point.

### IHL Education and Research Center - \$690,000

Repair, renovation, furnishing, equipping and expansion of and additions and improvements to campus buildings, facilities and infrastructure.

IHL Total: \$85,382,500

### System Legislation – Approved by the Governor:

## SB2681 Jackson State University; authorize to sell certain tax-forfeited parcels. 03/29 Approved by Governor

SB 2681 authorizes JSU to sell property it owns near campus with approval of the Board of Trustees. The legislation provides that properties not sold to neighboring property owners within 30 days will be transferred to a non-profit community development corporation (CDC) for development or sale. Effective July 1, 2019.

SB2867 University construction projects; authorize IHL Board to administer. 04/16

Approved by Governor

Harkins

SB 2867 authorizes the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning to administer certain construction projects funded by state bond funds. Prior to distribution of funds, IHL and the Department of Finance and Administration must enter into an agreement that stipulates the responsibilities of each party, applicable procurement regulations, documentation and reporting requirements and conditions for handling state bond funds. Effective July 1, 2019.

### Other Legislation affecting the IHL System – Approved by the Governor:

HB 150 Mississippi Dyslexia Forgivable Loan Program; clarify type of service commitment to qualify for. 04/16 Approved by Governor

Byrd

HB 150 expands the employment options for graduates who received the Dyslexia Therapy Forgivable Loan. This bill expands the definition of qualified employment to include working in either an instructional or clinical role in public schools or select non-public schools. HB 150 also revises the William F. Winter Teacher Forgivable Loan Program by authorizing awards through the Mississippi Teacher Loan Repayment (MTLR) program. Effective July 1, 2019.

HB 698 Construction contracts; allow public entities to allocate additional funds to project budget. 04/16 Approved by Governor

Weathersby

HB 698 authorizes allocating additional funds to a project at any time, including for the purpose of awarding a contract to the lowest and best bidder. Additional funds may not be allocated for the purpose of increasing negotiation authority. Effective upon passage.

HB 977 Nonresident physicians; allow athletic team physicians to provide treatment to players at sporting events in MS. 03/21 Approved by Governor

<u>Mims</u>

HB 977 authorizes nonresident physicians licensed in other states serving as

team physicians to treat visiting team athletes, coaches and staff participating in sporting events in Mississippi. Effective upon passage.

# HB 980 Agencies; delete provision that contractual obligations of shall be considered as incurred in fiscal period to be paid. 04/18 Approved by Governor

Read

HB 980 provides that expenses should be paid with funds appropriated for the fiscal year in which they were incurred. Expenses cannot be held for payment in the next fiscal year. Effective July 1, 2019.

# HB1160 Bonds; authorize issuance for construction of the Mississippi Center for Medically Fragile Children. 03/18 Approved by Governor

HB 1160 authorizes bonds in the amount of \$12,500,000 to be issued for the construction, furnishing and equipping of the Mississippi Center for Medically Fragile Children. Although not specified in the legislation, it is expected that the construction and operation of this facility will be overseen by the University of Mississippi Medical Center. Effective upon passage.

# HB1204 Mississippi Public Records Act; authorize public bodies to continue to contract even though right to protest still available. 03/21 Approved by Governor

HB 1204 amends Mississippi Code §25-61-5 to revise the Mississippi Public Records Act to authorize public bodies to continue to execute a contract if a court has not ruled on a protective order within ninety days of filing and to provide that the contract can still be protested after execution. Effective July 1, 2019.

# HB1465 Assault and aggravated assault; include health care providers in provisions regarding. 03/19 Approved by Governor

HB 1465 revises Mississippi Code §97-3-7 to expand the provision of law regarding the requirements for enhanced penalties for simple assault and aggravated assault by adding "health care providers." Effective July 1, 2019.

### HB1547 Controlled substances; revise Schedules I, II, and V. 04/16 Approved by Governor

Section 4 of HB 1547 establishes the Mississippi Hemp Cultivation Task Force. The task force will include the President of Mississippi State University or a designee, the President of Alcorn State University or a designee and the Director of the University of Mississippi School of Pharmacy National Center for Natural Products Research or a designee. The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce will chair the task force. The task force will make a comprehensive study of the potential for cultivation of hemp in Mississippi, examine and study approaches taken by other states for monitoring and regulation of hemp cultivation, and study the economic costs and benefits of hemp cultivation, market potential and opportunities for job creation. The

task force will file its report at least one month prior to the 2020 Legislative Session. Effective July 1, 2019.

### HB1666 Appropriation; reappropiation, DFA - Bureau of Building; FY20. 03/22 Approved by Governor

HB 1666 re-appropriates unspent funds for construction and/or repair and renovation projects at various state agencies and institutions of higher learning and community colleges. Section 4 re-appropriates \$2,602,690.00 for the repair and renovation of Green Hall at the University of Southern Mississippi. Section 5 re-appropriates \$3,252,166.00 for upgrades and renovation of the water treatment facility at Alcorn State University. Effective July 1, 2019.

### Appropriation; additional for various state agencies for Fiscal Year 2019. 04/16 Approved by Governor

HB 1667 authorizes additional funding for various state agencies and legal settlements in the current fiscal year. Section 19 authorizes additional spending authority for the Office of Student Financial Aid in the amount of \$1,500,000. Effective upon passage.

### SB2046 Public Records Act; exempt certain information technology-related information from. 03/29 Approved by Governor

SB 2046 protects information about Information Technology (IT) network infrastructure that could compromise an agency's IT security from disclosure under the Public Records Act. The protection applies to records about network architecture, schematics, and IT system designs, source code, detailed hardware and software inventories, security plans, vulnerability reports, security risk assessment details, security compliance reports, authentication credentials, security policies and processes, security incident reports and any other IT information that, if disclosed, could allow unauthorized access to IT assets. Effective July 1, 2019.

# SB2049 College tuition; spouses and children of U.S. Armed Forces members may keep in-state residency classification throughout enrollment. 03/29 Approved by Governor

SB 2049 allows military spouses who have attained residency in accordance with Mississippi Code §37-103-19 due to their active duty military spouse being stationed in Mississippi to maintain their status as residents for tuition purposes as long as they remain enrolled in good standing at a Mississippi institution of higher learning or community college, even if the member of the military is reassigned outside of Mississippi. Enrollment during summer school is not required to maintain resident status. Professional schools are exempted. Effective July 1, 2019.

# SB2053 Institutions of higher learning/community colleges; require the award of educational credits for military training or service. 03/28 Approved by Governor

Younger

SB 2053 directs the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the boards of trustees of the community and junior colleges to adopt policies requiring the award of educational credits to students who are veterans for courses that are part of the student's military training or service that meet the standards of the American Council on Education or equivalent standards for awarding academic credit. Credit shall be awarded in accordance with Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges standards. The policies must be in place no later than the 2020-2021 Academic Year and continuing thereafter. Effective July 1, 2019. Note: An IHL task force is working to develop a system-wide policy for awarding academic credit for military learning. The policy is expected to be adopted for implementation by Fall 2019.

# State budget; revise definition for identifying and inventorying programs used in the budgeting process. 03/29 Approved by Governor

SB 2393 revises definitions used in the budget process related to types of programs and evaluations. Authorizes adding additional agencies to participate in detailed inventorying of agency programs and activities. Effective July 1, 2019.

## SB2524 Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Residency Program; include psychiatry students. 03/29 Approved by Governor

SB 2524 expands the Mississippi Rural Physicians Scholarship Commission to include a licensed psychiatrist appointed by the Mississippi Chapter of the American Psychiatric Association. It also authorizes admitting students preparing to practice psychiatry in rural Mississippi. Effective July 1, 2019.

# SB2835 Mississippi First Responders Health and Safety Act; create. 04/16 Approved Carter by Governor

SB 2835 provides that when a firefighter or law enforcement officer who has completed 10 years of service is unable to perform his or her regular duties due to cancer caused by his or her work, he or she is entitled to certain lump sum and monthly benefits under the Mississippi First Responders Health and Safety Act. Effective July 1, 2019.

## SB2876 Public purchasing; extend repeal date on law which regulates contracts for <u>Fillingane</u> energy efficiency services. 03/22 Approved by Governor

SB 2876 extends the repeal date on Mississippi Code §31-7-14 regarding public contracts for energy efficiency services from July 1, 2019 to July 1, 2021. Institutions of higher learning are eligible to enter into these contracts. Effective July 1, 2019.

### SB3049 Appropriation; Finance and Administration, Department of. 04/18 Approved by Governor

Section 15 of SB 3049 allocates \$11,000,000 to the Department of Finance and Administration for repair, renovation, and improvements of state-owned properties, universities and community colleges. Section 25 (kk) allocates \$1,000,000 to the University of Mississippi Research Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences for CBD oil clinical trials. Effective July 1, 2019.

#### Other tracked legislation – Approved by the Governor:

### Windstorm Underwriting Association; authorize to levy recoupable and nonrecoupable assessments. 04/03 Approved by Governor

HB 444 makes revisions the Mississippi Windstorm Underwriting Association Law. IHL does not secure its wind coverage under the MWUA. However, Section 14 of the bill provides for additional rounds of fire trucks under the Rural Fire Truck Acquisition Assistance Program which has helped fund fire protection for universities in the past. Effective July 1, 2019.

### HB 626 CON: provide for direct appeals to Court of Appeals of Department of Health orders pertaining to. 03/21 Approved by Governor

HB 626 provides that the Mississippi Supreme Court shall conduct an expedited judicial review of any appeal order of the chancery court relating to the issuance of a Health Care Certificate of Need. The Supreme Court must render a final order regarding the appeal no later than 120 days from the date of the final order by the chancery court is certified to the Supreme Court. Effective July 1, 2019.

## HB 752 Dental Insurance benefits; prohibit the denial or recoupment of a claim in certain circumstances. 03/19 Approved by Governor

HB 753 amends Mississippi Code §83-51-1 to define certain terms in the Dental Care Benefits Law. It also creates a new section to require Dental Service Contractors to establish appeal procedures for claim denials based on lack of medical necessity; prohibits claim denials for procedures included in a prior authorization except under certain circumstances; sets a deadline for issuing prior authorization approvals; and prohibits the recoupment of a claim in certain circumstances. Effective July 1, 2019.

### HB1048 Hemodialysis technicians; provide for registration under State Board of Health. 03/21 Approved by Governor

Johnson (87th)

HB 1048 establishes a statewide program for the registration of hemodialysis technicians under the State Board of Health. Effective July 1, 2019.

SB2268 Medicaid; authorize reimbursement for services provided by a licensed freestanding psychiatric hospital. 03/28 Approved by Governor

Wiggins

SB 2268 authorizes the Division of Medicaid to reimburse for services provided to beneficiaries in a freestanding psychiatric hospital and to seek waivers and revise its State Plan as necessary for implementation. Effective upon passage.

### SB2447 Career and technical grants to schools for qualified students; provide for. 03/29 Approved by Governor

Tollison

SB 2447 establishes a grant program through the Mississippi Department of Education to assist students seeking qualified industry certifications. The grants provide up to \$600 per student for industry certification examination fees, student instructional support and professional development for teachers in career and technical education. Effective July 1, 2019.

SB2541 Budget process; bring forward various sections relating to. <u>04/18 Approved</u> <u>Clarke</u> by Governor

SB 2541 provides for transfers necessary to fund the state budget. Effective upon passage.

State employment; revise definition of the term "disabled veteran" as used Parks for veterans preference. 03/22 Approved by Governor

SB 2863 revises the definition of "disabled veteran" as used for veterans' preference in state employment. The new definition states a "disabled veteran" is one who the Veterans Administration has certified to have a service-connected disability rating of at least 30 percent within the last 90 days or a veteran who was awarded the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat. Effective July 1, 2019.

SB2892 Community hospitals; revise provisions regarding service area and proposed sale of. 03/29 Approved by Governor

Wiggins

SB 2892 amends Mississippi Code §41-13-10 to revise the definition of a community hospital service area to include areas outside the state. It also revises provisions regarding how the owner of a community hospital can sell the hospital. Effective July 1, 2019.
